



Junior Discretionary Testing at Georgetown Country Club

The Junior Discretionary Pass is awarded to members between the ages of 10 and 13 who go through a short training on the course and take a written test. Successful completion means these young members can golf without adult supervision at Georgetown or with other Pass holders or kids 14 and over. Non-members who play with them are not eligible for the Pass and will not be allowed on the course without adult supervision if they are under the age of 14.

The focus is on safety, etiquette and pace of play. Some of the Rules of Golf are covered but these are not the main focus of the program. The training and testing are conducted by adult members who volunteer their time. Sign up is done at the Pro Shop desk. Up to three kids can go through at the same time.

This does not take the place of lessons and is not associated with the Junior League. Kids who sign up should bring their clubs to the training and test. Occasionally appointments can be set up with the trainers on an individual basis depending upon their schedule and course availability. The Pass can be taken away if the young member does not follow the rules of the Club.

Generally, young members do well during training and testing if they have played with adults before. If they have never played or rarely been on a course it shows.
